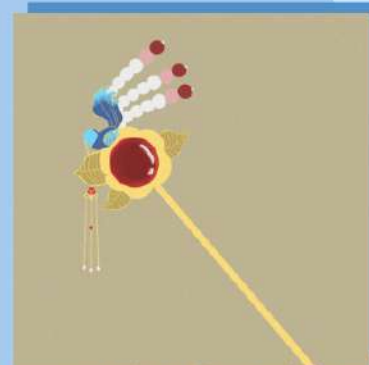
歷史背景及服飾、配飾介紹

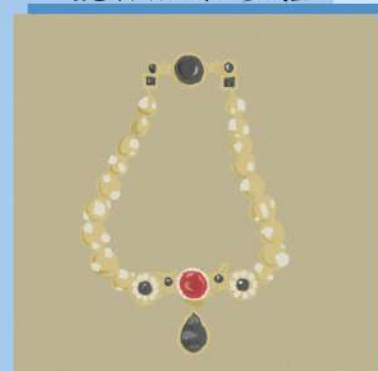
唐朝服飾
